Properly structured, this is a solid wine. Great swathes of plum fruits are partnered with firm tannins. It is dark and firm, with a dense character. Touches of chocolate and roasted coffee go with the rich plums. Drink from 2015.



BEST BUY

Full, ripe and smoky, this well-balanced wine has a dense texture to offset the bright red fruits and acidity. Spice, smoky flavors and a fresh red fruit aftertaste give a ready-to-drink feel.

This superrich wine has luscious plum fruits, cushioned tannins and a ripe character. Full black cherries bring out the density and the solid backdrop. It can be drunk now, but will be better from 2016.

This is a fruity wine, full of black cherries and plums. From the most northerly of the Beaujolais crus, it has style as well as weight and structure, although the fruitiness that dominates. It is ready to drink now.



88

This structured wine discloses dark tannins and a firm, dense character. The granite soil comes through strongly in the cool minerality and tight texture. It has weight and potential richness, but it does need to age. Drink from 2016.

The wine has light structure, with tannins that are already well integrated into the red cherry fruits. Rich and well concentrated, it reveals good depth of flavor. At the end, acidity gives an attractive, fresh aftertaste.



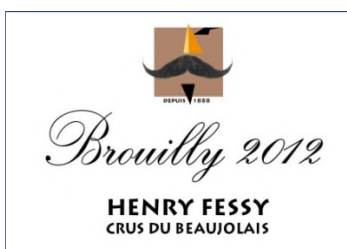

Ample fruitiness is accompanied by an attractive tannin and mineral texture and well-integrated acidity. It's a rounded wine that is ready to drink, with red cherry fruits that are full and ripe.

The wine is full of acidity as well as bright raspberry and red currant fruits. It has a light, fresh feel that's given added weight by firmer fruit tannins and a concentrated dry aftertaste. Drink from 2016.

The wine is round, soft and ripe with attractive light-weight tannins. Plum fruit flavors are right up front. It's rich while remaining easy and drinkable now.
